MAKING BIG BASIN SAFE FOR PEOPLE AND WILDLIFE

- On-site milling operations are ongoing to mill wood deemed hazardous.
- Temporary facilities and signage are being developed in preparation for the interim limited use area of the park for Summer 2022.
- D Bids for the next hazardous tree removal contract are expected the first week of February.
- Bids for emergency contract (post storm) to replace failed culvert at Union Creek are expected first week of February.

LEARN ABOUT BIG BASIN'S RECOVERY

- The second webinar about Big Basin was held on January 20th covering topics of resilient planning, design, and management in the context of Big Basin's future. The webinar was well attended and the recording will be posted on the website.
