MAKING BIG BASIN SAFE FOR PEOPLE AND WILDLIFE

- ☐ After two previous volunteer days had to be rescheduled due to forecasted wind, a volunteer work day was completed on May 1st including creating burn piles, placing fencing and general cleanup of the former headquarters area.
- □ Culvert replacements on Sky Meadow Road are complete. A contract to replace additional culverts throughout the park has been put out to prospective bidders. The culvert and slip out repair at Union Creek on Sky Meadow Road is permitted and a contract is in place; work is anticipated to be completed by the end of the summer.
- □ Saddle Mountain is continuing to be upgraded. Water system distribution has been completed and the water system improvements are underway. Interior building upgrades are underway to convert the building for park operation and administration. Electrical service upgrades are complete.
- ☐ The contract to complete temporary improvements for public access such as the interpretive staging area, fencing and temporary restrooms at the former Headquarters is in final review with the contracts team and work is anticipated to start in May.

- ☐ The final trail repair in Fall Creek is the Ridge Trail which has been completed and will be ready to be opened in early May! We are very grateful for all the work our staff have done to make this a reality.
- ☐ The Big Basin Volunteer Trail Crew and the Santa Cruz District Trail Crew have been working on the Redwood Loop Trail in preparation for the summer reopening.
